## LUCA EINAUDI

Dr Luca Einaudi is an economist and historian. He has pursued a dual career as a senior civil servant on economic policies (immigration, G8-G20 and financial crises, housing and transportation infrastructures) and a scholar in the history of economic policies at the European and international level (immigration, monetary unification, financial crises and Europe). His education, research and teaching have taken place in Rome, Cambridge, Princeton, Harvard, Paris, and. He is currently a General Director in the Department for Economic Policy and Planning in the Italian Prime Minister's Office.
